6. Set realistic goals with your players
7. Ensure playing areas are safe before play.
8. Be a team leader and continuously set a positive, fair, and good sportsmanship example for young athletes.
9. Continue to learn about young people and this sport and how to help them develop their potential.
10. Accept the attitude that the dignity of the youngsters is far more important than the "win at all costs" perspective.
